ASK YOUR PHARMACIST

Pharmacists are experts in many areas of healthcare and can offer advice on a wide range of long term conditions and common illnesses such as coughs, colds and stomach upsets. You don't need an appointment to see a pharmacist and many have private consultation areas.



CALL NHS 111

If your GP surgery is closed and you're not sure where to go then you should make a free phone call to NHS 111, which is available 24/7. An adviser will ask you questions to assess your symptoms and then give you the advice you need, or direct you to the best service for your care needs.



YOUR LOCAL SERVICES

The Walk-in Centre based in Ashton-under-Lyne is available for Urgent (non-emergency) Care 8am – 8pm Monday-Sunday including the Bank Holidays.

A number of local opticians across Tameside and Glossop also provide a free NHS service for minor eye complaints which you can access during the Bank Holiday period.

Make sure you order any repeat medication you need in plenty of time so you have a good supply during bank holiday closures.
